 School) at 4001-7th Ave. On Saturday, July 4, join us for the Ice Cream Social at
 George Green Park, 1498 6th Ave., from Noon-3 p.m.
- **Blaine:** July 4th Flag-raising ceremony at 8:30 a.m. at Blaine City Hall and fireworks at 10 p.m. at the National Sports Center (1700 150th Ave NE)
- **Coon Rapids:** Date: Fireworks on July 4th at 10pm, at the Sand Creek Athletic Field and Park (1008 Northdale Blvd. NW, Coon Rapids, Minn.). Also features a carnival, craft and craft show, live music and parade.
- **St. Louis Park:** Fireworks at Aquila Park are a St. Louis Park tradition! Concessions, vendors and a special performance by Stevie and the Table Rockers (rock-n-roll music) will be at the park, 7 p.m. 9:30 p.m. Fireworks begin at approximately 10 p.m. Although leashed dogs are allowed in our parks, we strongly discourage them from attending due to their hearing sensitivity. Saturday, July 4 (rain date is Sunday, July 5) Aquila Park, 3110 Xylon Ave. S.
- White Bear Lake: 4th of July Fireworks, Flyover & Music at Memorial Beach 8:00 p.m. Music starts 8:30 p.m. Flyover with four T-6 planes 10:00 p.m. Fireworks Memorial Beach. Music by Shoreview Northern Lights Variety Band, followed by amazing fireworks display over White Bear Lake. In case of rain, fireworks will be July 5th. Free.
- Red White & Boom, "Consider this the be-all end-all of everything that is, was and will be for your 4th of July in Minneapolis in 2015." 10:00pm -Fireworks, Minneapolis Riverfront District
- * Red, White and Boom is the recommended celebration for those cities not celebrating anything locally within their own.
